Media Fact Sheet

Summary:

Nestled in the hills north of Healdsburg, Jordan Winery's French-inspired chateau was constructed in the mid-1970s with hospitality in mind—at a time when wine tourism was virtually non-existent. The chateau's west-facing wing features a dining room, commercial kitchen and three grand suites—guest accommodations that had not been renovated since their debut in 1979. Owner John Jordan, whose parents founded the winery, used the downturn in visitor numbers during the pandemic as an opportunity to embark on a \$1 million remodel of the chateau's three suites, led by interior designer [Maria Haidamus](#) of San Francisco. After eight months of renovations, including floor-to-ceiling bathroom remodels, these luxury accommodations reopened in June 2021.
